# What is baptism?

As **parents**, baptism means thanking God for his gift of life and starting your child on the journey of faith, asking for the Church's support.

For your **child**, it means turning towards Christ and becoming a member of the local and worldwide Christian family.

Baptism is a sacrament, a visible sign of God's love: we thank God for his gift of life and publicly acknowledge his love. We acknowledge that we all need to turn away from selfishness and evil, and accept God's offer of a new start.

Parents, godparents and the church community help your child to follow a way of life that reflects goodness and light, and shares this light with others. A lighted candle is given as a reminder of the light which has come into the child's life.





# **Parents**

## What is involved?

A child should normally be baptised at the parish church or the church the parents usually attend. However, even if you aren't a regular churchgoer, your child can still be baptised.

The usual time for baptism at Christ Church Lille is during the 10.30 am Sunday morning service. During the service, parents, godparents, friends and family, share in this special day, together with members of the congregation who will welcome this new member of Christ's family.

When you bring your child for baptism, you will be asked to answer, on your child's behalf, that you believe in God and that you will bring up your child to follow Jesus. You will be supported by the godparents and by the church community, who also make promises to support you and pray for you.

Godparents make promises on the day, to encourage their godchild to grow and understand and live in a Christian way. Godparents will discuss what these promises mean when they meet with the Chaplain before the service, to prepare for this special day and of course, to prepare for their role as Godparent.

As a Godparent, you have been chosen to be a special part of a child's life, because the parents know you and trust you. Because of this special role, Godparents must have been baptised themselves. They should also be confirmed, but if not, please talk about this with the chaplain.

# What happens during the service?

During the service some special symbols and actions are used. At the heart of the service, the child is baptised with water. This takes place around the font, and you can see a picture of Christ church Lille font in the picture on the cover of this leaflet and in the photo above.

Other important moments are the sign of the cross which the priest makes on the child's forehead, and the anointing with oil.

And of course, there are the promises which you and the godparents make, on the child's behalf, and the welcome by the church community.

During the meetings with the chaplain before the baptism, there will be the opportunity to learn more about these elements and what they mean.





# What now?

- Parents should contact the Chaplain and arrange to meet and discuss arrangements. The Chaplain will tell you about meetings before the Baptism can take place.
- Complete the Application for Infant Baptism form and return it to the Chaplain at least 14 days before the arranged date.

#### Fees

There are *no fees* for having your child baptized. We would certainly welcome a gift to help with the costs associated with your celebration and to assist with the ministry of Christ Church.
